




Top line outcomes and costs

Entity Group performed a data sharing maturity assessment by working with and interviewing key WODA personnel and associated stakeholders. As a result of this analysis we proposed a desired target state and, working with the WODA team provided a suggested roadmap and proposal to achieve the following:

- Deliver multi-million pounds of savings through fraud prevention
- Reduce risks to vulnerable individuals and families
- Positively influence decisions on economic growth, enabling businesses to thrive and communities to develop
- Support General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) compliance
- Deliver material benefit from year one

Our recommendation is that these actions are started immediately.



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

Key issues

1. Public-sector agencies in Worcestershire face, with fewer resources, an unprecedented increase in local demand generated by complex social problems and an increasing economic growth.
2. "Partners across Worcestershire" hold a comprehensive and complex range of information within their data. The value of this cannot be realised until the critical data is linked-up and made available (legally, securely and in real time) to practitioners across the partnership on a strictly enforced 'need to know' basis.
3. The public in Worcestershire expect the agencies to make efficient use of public funds to provide effective services to them. This includes interacting with them in a holistic way and not having to repeat their details and circumstances multiple times to different agencies.
4. Economic growth will be critical to Worcestershire's future success and how to influence and positively impact this growth will be vital to be how the community prospers.
5. Identifying the right interventions at the right time so resources are targeted effectively to make the biggest impact and minimise risk.

Main objectives

1. To assess how data is currently shared, how data should be shared in future and what needs to be done to get there.
2. To arm strategic decision makers and frontline staff with the fullest possible information to make informed decisions and interventions.
 - a. Enabling service design changes to be made in an agile and iterative way.
 - b. Further informing the ways in which data is shared and made available for continuous improvements.
3. To ensure that evaluation of the impact of those decisions can be fed back more frequently:
